The WWW.NMEAAC.ORG website will open on April 1st and close on May 29th.

The Edward Miller Memorial Music Scholarship Fund



Founded by the Music Committee of the Unitarian Universalist Congregation at Shelter Rock (UUCSR) in June, 2004, the Edward Miller Memorial Scholarship Fund honors the memory of Edward Miller (1943 – 1997), UUCSR Music Director and Life-Long Music Educator.

The stipend, in an amount to be determined each year by the Music Committee, will be used to further the recipient's music education. It will be delivered in one lump sum to the recipient by a member of the Music Committee at the awards ceremony of the recipient's local high school, which must be located within Nassau County, New York. The Music Committee will also invite the recipient to a worship service at UUCSR at which his/her achievement will be celebrated.

In 2019, two stipends of \$2,500 each are planned.

The NYSSMA festival season is here. There are nine NYSSMA Festivals in Nassau County in March, four in April, five in May with two additional Majors Festivals also in May. Registration deadlines are quickly approaching. When assigning music to students please be sure to be using the current **Manual Edition 32, dated July 1, 2018** – as only literature listed in that edition can be performed for a grade. In addition, please be sure to check that every student you register including the private piano students, are indeed performing works from the current manual. Your diligence will hopefully provide that additional layer of insurance for students this first year of a new manual.

Applications for the upcoming <u>Adjudicator Orientation Seminar</u> are currently being accepted. Nassau is hosting the two-day event this year; March 29-30 at the Uniondale NYSSMA Festival. The application is contained in this newsletter, the School Music News magazine, and at the Zone I3 webpage and NYSSMA website. All are encouraged to enroll and consider making themselves available to judge one festival per year. The deadline for applications is March I.

The 47th annual Joseph R. Sugar NYSSMA Day in Albany as always, takes place the first Monday in the March, this year on March 4. On that day NYSSMA ascends on our state capital, specifically the Legislative Office Building and the Senate Building. We subdivide into cohorts based on geography (school location), and then visit legislators that represent our schools and school districts. Members of the cohorts are provided with appointment times and we meet with legislators who are expecting us. We meet to advocate for our students. This year I'm asking districts to consider permitting an additional teacher to attend and participate. It makes a lasting impression when our legislators see the depth of interest and support among our dedicated music teaching staff. Please think about inquiring in your district and participating. A free coach bus is chartered for round trip transportation from Long Island.

Majors Registration is open on the NYSSMA Website <u>www.nyssma.org</u>. Majors registration closes on March I and all fees are due March I.

All-State Applications will go online by the end of the January. As always there will be a link on the NYSSMA website to complete and submit individual student All-State applications. Teachers will print the form, obtain the necessary signatures, and then send the hard copy to the Festival Host where the student's audition will take place. All-State applications must be received by the Festival Host prior to the students' performance.

Submittable is the name of the company that will be administrating the new online process that will be utilized to submit conference session proposals for next year's 2019 NYSSMA Winter Conference. Instructions will be forth coming regarding submitting a conference request proposal.

The Bi-annual Eastern Division Conference will take place April 4-7 at the David L. Lawrence Convention Center, Pittsburgh, PA. The event will take place Thursday through Sunday with over 200 sessions. Additionally will be the rehearsal and performance of the Eastern Division Honors Band, Orchestra, Chorus, and Jazz Ensemble. Please reach out directly to the chair-people with conference performance questions. New York has a total of 217 students accepted and 63 of the 217 are from Nassau County.

Earlier this month the NAfME Eastern Division ballot for President – Elect was digitally provided to membership via email. The election runs for 30 calendar days and you are encourage to click on the link that comes to you via email and vote! On the ballot for Eastern Division President Elect are NYSSMA Immediate Past President, Michael Brownell and Susan Barry from the Maine Music Educators Association.

The NAfME Academy represents over 100 hours of professional development available for subscription. Please locate at the NAfME website at the very top of the homepage, the menu selection 'For Teacher's'. Please then select the NAfME Academy. The academies are CTLE approved as well.

Recently, at the NYSSMA Winter Conference, we heard from Jennifer Childress. Jennifer is the new Arts Associate for the State Education Department. Jennifer began her work as our state is engrossed in the New York Learning Standards for the Arts adaptation and transition. Ms. Childress explained that NYSED is currently organizing an Arts CAP (Content Advisory Panel), with representation from throughout the state for the five arts disciplines. Additionally, NYSED has laid out a 5-year plan titled the Arts Roadmap. The plan includes three phases:

- Phase I, which essentially has passed. This was the initial period whereby schools and school districts scheduled training for their teachers, performed gap analysis to determine what if anything needs to be changed or adapted, discussed resource needs, investigate partnerships to gain the resources, and ultimately design a 3 year plan to complete the transition process.

- Phase 2 continues with the adaptation of prior curriculum, adapting instruction to meet best practices, develop formative and summative assessments, share on multiple platforms (district wide meetings), the web, state web sites, re-evaluate resource needs, and consider new courses.


- Phase 3 then concludes with the question; are the standards and the adaptations sustainable? This phase is where we revisit and refine, analyze assessment results, review for improvement, and expand partnerships.

In summary, basically there is an internal focus for Phase 1, then external focus for Phase 2 and Phase 3.

Please be sure to check: the NYSSMA Festival Registration Deadlines for your school, and the new <u>Manual 32</u> for your students. I wish the best for you and your students during the upcoming Spring Evaluation Season.
